



PR22 Precision Rifle Rimfire 2024 Series Rules

- PR22 rules will follow the centrefire series guidelines and general principles for course of fire,
 course construction.
- Divisions currently for the 2024 PR22/PRS SA Rimfire series will be.
 - Open
 - Ladies Open
 - Senior open (55 yrs and older)
 - Junior open (12 yrs 18 yrs)
 - o Factory (Rifles will follow IPRF guidelines as updated from time to time)
- At MD's discretion matches may cater for
 - o Cadets (sub 12 yrs) Currently not for classification, no log scores calculated.
 - o PCP. Currently not for classification, no log scores calculated.
- Only paid up SAPRF members will be eligible for log scores.
- Free members will be afforded a 7-day grace period after a match to become a full member and have their scores recorded on logs.
- Shooters will compete individually. The competitor with the highest score at the end of the match is declared the winner. Score percentages will be calculated from the overall match winner score.
- Division/Subdivision score will be calculated from the overall match winner's score. That percentage value score will be the score used for logs.
- Should a Junior want to be included in overall classification he/she shall be entitled to enter in Open class and will shoot the Open class course of fire. Some matches may allow for extra time or support and easier positions for junior class.
- Currently no custom loaded ammunition is allowed. Ammunition will be limited to commercially available 40 grain lead bullets. This is to limit costs and allow for equal accessibility to PR22.

- Provincial Series will run as follows:
 - Operate provincially where shooters will have to shoot 3 matches in a division in their province for a total of 300 series points.
 - o Provincial Matches to shoot 7 9 stages with min 72 round count.
 - Club matches are to be for training and development. Extra time or easier positions may be allowed at match directors discretion. No logs will be held by SAPRF.
- National Series will run as follows:
 - Operates nationally where shooters will have to shoot a minimum of 3 matches in a division for a total of 300 series points. Maximum of two national matches in the shooter's home province will count. At least one national match to be shot out of the home province.
 - National Matches to shoot 10 15 stages with min 105 round count, can be a one day or two-day event.
 - Then a PR22/PRS SA Rimfire Championship match will be held to count 200 points.
 Minimum round count to be 130 rounds.
 - The yearly National leader board will be determined by shooters' score out of 500 points.
 - o Championship match to rotate to a different province yearly when possible.
- Federation national colours in PR22 will be applied to ExCo for the top 5 who shoot the US PRS
 Series championship match.
- Federation provincial colours in PR22 will be applied to ExCo for the top 5 who represent their province at the SAPRF National Series championship match.
